

Retroactive Payment FAQ's

Q.1. What are retroactive payments?

A.1 In order to reimburse providers for rates that were increased effective October 1, 2018, Care 4 Kids will issue a separate retroactive payment for the difference from the old rates to the new rates (if applicable) for eligible providers during the retroactive period of October 1, 2018 through June 30, 2019.

Q.2. Am I eligible for the retroactive payments?

A.2. Care 4 Kids licensed family child care providers and unlicensed relative providers who:

- Were an active Care 4 Kids provider on July 1, 2019;
- Provided service to at least one Care 4 Kids child on July 1, 2019; and
- received payment for care provided anytime during the period October 1, 2018 through June 30, 2019.

Q.3. How much money will I receive?

A.3. If you previously charged a higher amount than the new October 1, 2018 reimbursement rates, you will receive retroactive payments. You will receive the difference between what was already paid to you and the new October 1, 2018 reimbursement rate. Click on the links below to view the new rate tables.

Attention provider members of the CSEA-SEIU Local 2001 Labor Union: union dues will be deducted from the retroactive payments.

Q.4. How will I receive my retroactive payment?

A.4. You will receive a separate retroactive payment using your current payment method on file.

Q.5. Will these retroactive payments be included on my 2019 1099 form?

A.5. Yes, retroactive payments issued in 2019 will also be included on your 1099 form for 2019.

Q.6. Do I need to submit an invoice to receive my retroactive payments?

A.6. No, all retroactive payments will be made automatically by Care 4 Kids. Retroactive payments are scheduled to be paid on October 28, 2019. These payments will post to your selected payment method by November 1, 2019.
